

Request for Proposals Public Notice

Alta California Regional Center Community Placement Plan For Fiscal Year 2018-2019

Alta California Regional Center (ACRC), serving individuals with developmental disabilities, has identified a need to develop the following programs within the ACRC catchment area (Alpine, Colusa, El Dorado, Nevada, Placer, Sacramento, Sierra, Sutter, Yolo, and Yuba) for clients who are currently residing in a State Developmental Center (SDC), Mental Health Rehabilitation Center (MHRC), Institutes for Mental Disease (IMD), at risk of admission to one of these restrictive settings or to address services and supports needs of consumers living in the community.

PROPOSED NEEDS

A brief description of each project is on page two of this notice, some of which will be developed using a Housing Development Organization (HDO).

ACRC is hosting a Request for Proposal (RFP) Orientation to introduce these projects in greater detail including the targeted client profiles for each. The RFP will be handed out at this orientation. **Attending this orientation is mandatory in order to apply. Any proposals received from applicants who did not attend will not be considered.**

Project 3: Enhanced Behavior Supports Home (EBSH) – Nursing with HDO

Four (4) bed Enhanced Behavioral Support Home (EBSH) with nursing supports to meet the needs of clients with behavioral and mental health support needs, who may also have medical conditions that require monitoring and intervention. Clients targeted for this EBSH-Nursing will be male and female adults exiting out of Porterville Developmental Center Secure Treatment Area who are expected to have medical support needs not limited to diabetes care and severe behaviors including, but not limited to, verbal and physical aggression, property destruction, resistive to daily routines, self-injurious behaviors, and AWOL. Clients may be non-verbal, non-ambulatory, and require assistance with their ADL's. Clients may also have psychiatric diagnoses and will require management of mental health needs.

Project 4: Housing for clients in SLS with HDO

Start-up funds for HDO to renovate two (2) duplexes for clients with supportive living services. Start-up funds must be leveraged with other local, state, and/or federal funds. Clients targeted for this home will be male and female adults in need of low cost housing options who can successfully live on their own with assistance from a supportive living agency. Clients may be non-verbal, non-ambulatory, and require assistance with their ADL's.

Project 5: Enhanced Behavior Supports Home (EBSH) – Nursing with HDO

Four (4) bed Enhanced Behavioral Support Home (EBSH) with nursing supports to meet the needs of clients with extensive behavioral and mental health support needs who may have medical conditions that require monitoring and intervention. Clients targeted for this EBSH will be male and female adults who are expected to have medical support needs not limited to diabetes care and severe behaviors including, but not limited to, verbal and physical aggression, property destruction, resistive to daily routines, self-injurious behaviors, and AWOL. Clients may be non-verbal, non-ambulatory, and require assistance with their ADL's. Clients may also have psychiatric diagnoses and will require management of mental health needs.
