## Services for those who are Deaf or those with hearing loss:

## Services for those who are blind or have low vision

- Touch tours enable blind or low-vision visitors to experience a selection of original artworks through touch. Tactile opportunities can also be provided and include samples of various art media and tools that can be touched by visitors. Touch tours are free but must be scheduled in advance.
