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### **Substance Abuse Screening Tool**

Exploring the alcohol and drug use patterns of Alta California Regional Center Clients is an important first step in identifying those individuals in need of assistance as well as those who are at risk for developing problems. The CRAFFT is a simple screening instrument that is used with adolescents that can also be used with Regional Center clients.

CRAFFT is a mnemonic acronym of first letters of key words in the 6 screening questions. The questions should be asked exactly as written after receiving a yes to any of the three questions: Part A During the PAST 12 MONTHS did you:

- Drink any alcohol (more than a few sips)?
   (Do not count sips of alcohol taken during family or religious events.)
- 2. Smoke any marijuana?
- 3. Use anything else to get high?

("Anything else" includes illegal drugs, over the counter and prescription drugs and things that you sniff or "huff".)

Part B

- C Have you ever ridden in a CAR driven by someone (including yourself) who was "high" or had been using alcohol or drugs?
- **R** Do you ever use alcohol or drugs to RELAX, feel better about yourself, or fit in?
- **A** Do you ever use alcohol or drugs while you are by yourself, or ALONE?
- **F** Do you ever FORGET things you did while using alcohol or drugs?
- **F** Do your family or FRIENDS ever tell you that you should cut down on your drinking or drug use?
- T Have you ever gotten into TROUBLE while you were using alcohol or drugs?

**Scoring:** Each "yes" response score in Part B scores 1 point. A total score of 2 or higher is a positive screen, indicating a need for additional assessment.

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

CRAFFT Scoring: Each "yes" response in Part B scores 1 point.

A total score of 2 or higher is a positive screen, indicating a need for additional assessment.

#### DSM-IV Diagnostic Criteria<sup>8</sup> (Abbreviated)

Substance Abuse (1 or more of the following):

- . Use causes failure to fulfill obligations at work, school, or home
- · Recurrent use in hazardous situations (e.g. driving)
- Recurrent legal problems
- Continued use despite recurrent problems

#### Substance Dependence (3 or more of the following):

- Tolerance
- Withdrawal
- Substance taken in larger amount or over longer period of time than planned
- Unsuccessful efforts to cut down or quit
- · Great deal of time spent to obtain substance or recover from effect
- · Important activities given up because of substance
- Continued use despite harmful consequences

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## **Brief Intervention**

Talking with someone about their drinking or drug use is usually not easy for most of us. Here are a few things to keep in mind.

- People are often uncomfortable in discussing their alcohol and drug use. Avoid comments that might be interpreted as judgmental or moralistic.
- Remind the client that you are not here to make them change, rather your purpose is to help them explore whether they have a problem and to help them change if they want to.
- Focus the discussion on how their alcohol and drug use may be placing them in unsafe situations.
- Also, focus on how their alcohol and drug use may be limiting their independence and achieving their important goals.
- If they wish to change their use of alcohol and drugs help them to determine reasonable goals for this change, and explore what might get in the way of being able to make those changes/achieve their goals.
- Explore alternatives to using alcohol and/or drugs in situations and what they can do instead of using, or to reduce their use.

### **Alcohol and Drug Quiz for Developmental Disability Professionals**

# Alcohol and Drug Quiz for Developmental Disability Professionals Answers

- 1. (False) First, 12-step groups are not treatment, and while they are by far the most common mutual aid approaches to foster recovery, there are other methodologies as well including SMART Recovery, Women for Sobriety, and LifeRing Recovery are a few.
- 2. (All) Unaddressed alcohol and drug use disorder undermines all outcomes. Of particular importance to persons with a developmental disability are increased risks to health and safety, as well as limitations in independent living.
- 3. (False) There are no "safer" alcoholic beverages. Beer and wine tend to be more socially acceptable for use earlier in the day. A can of cold beer at 11 am on a summer morning is less likely to raise eyebrows than a shot of bourbon.
- 4. (True) This old conventional wisdom has become outdated with advances in intervention and strategies such as motivational interviewing and harm reduction.
- 5. (True) Alcohol use is contraindicated with many psychoactive medications. These alcohol/drug interactions can be synergistic, i.e. increasing the mind-altering effects.
- 6. (True) Sometimes referred to as alcoholic amnesia this phenomenon is indicative of chronic alcohol use disorder.
- 7. (E) Many common household products are used by inhalant abusers because of their low cost and easy availability.

- 10. (True) Independent living calls for good judgment, smart choices and the ability to learn and adapt. All these skills are reduced by use of alcohol and drugs for persons with developmental disabilities.

## County Alcohol and Drug Services Administrators

Publicly-funded alcohol and drug treatment and recovery services in California are planned and delivered at the county level. Within each county health department there is a department that contracts with and oversees community-based providers that actually deliver the services. Often "Alcohol and Drugs" or "Behavioral Health" are terms that appear in the titles of these department. These departments usually have an administrator or chief who is the central coordinator for most of what happens in these department, including receiving complaints about barriers to service. Since persons with disabilities are a protected class publicly-funded treatment agencies must comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and Section 504 of The Rehabilitation Act of 1973 as amended.

#### Glossary of Common AOD Terms

**Alcoholics Anonymous (AA):** A voluntary, 12-step, mutual aid program concerned with providing support and sobriety for people with alcohol problems. Narcotics Anonymous (NA) is primarily for people with drug problems.

**Addiction:** A repeated activity that continuously causes harm to oneself or others (e.g. a substance's continuous presence in the bloodstream).

**Addict:** A stigmatizing slang term for an individual with an addictive disorder. Preferred: person with substance use disorder.

**AOD:** Stands for (Alcohol and Other Drugs).

**AODA:** Stands for (Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse).

**Codependence:** A family member's or friend's suffering that is the result of the side effects of one's addiction; it occurs when one takes responsibility for another's actions and helps that person avoid facing his or her problems directly to maintain the relationship.

**Denial:** One's failure to either admit or realize his or her addiction or to recognize and accept the harm it can cause.

**Detoxification** (**Detox**): The process of removing a toxic substance (e.g. a drug) from the body.

**Disease Model:** A theory of alcoholism that considers the addiction a disease rather than a social or psychological issue.

**Enabling:** Helping an addicted person do things they can or should be doing for themselves; causes disease progression.

**Fetal Alcohol Syndrome (FAS):** Birth defects/abnormalities in babies of alcoholic and alcohol abusing mothers.

Fetal Drug Syndrome (FDS): Birth defects/abnormalities in babies of drug abusing mothers.

**Harm Reduction:** Often the first stage of addiction treatment; reducing therapy instead of stopping the target behavior.

**Medication Assisted Treatment/Recovery (MAT/MAR):** The use of prescribed medications such as methadone or naltrexone to support someone either short term detox or long term recovery.

**Recovery:** Reducing or ceasing substance dependence; often followed by one's personal life being turned around by way of a supportive environment.

**Relapse:** Symptom recurrence after a period of sobriety or drug use cessation.

**Screening:** Measurement tool for the extent of an alcohol or drug problem (e.g., self-completion questionnaire/life-history assessment).

**Sponsor:** In 12-step mutual aid groups a sponsor assists another member in understanding and taking the steps.

**Tolerance:** Condition in which one must increase their use of a drug for it to have the same effect.

**Treatment:** Professional assistance to respond to substance use dependence. Can be outpatient, inpatient, residential, therapeutic community.

**Trigger:** Anything that results in psychological and then physical relapse.

# 12-Steps of Alcoholics Anonymous Traditional Language vs. Modified for Easier Understanding

1. We admitted we were powerless over alcohol—that our lives had become unmanageable.	1. We admitted we had no control over drugs and alcohol and that we had become powerless and could not control ourselves or our lives.	
2. Came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity.	2. Came to believe in a power greater than ourselves and that this power could return us to health and being good to ourselves.	
3. Made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him.	3. Because we wanted to feel better we made a decision to turn our lives, inside and out, over to this higher power which some of us call God.	
4. Made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.	4. Learned about ourselves and made a list of all our strengths and weaknesses even though we were afraid and it was hard to do. We added to this list all of the things that we had been hurt or angry about for a long time.	
5. Admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.	5. Told God, ourselves, and another person all of the things on our list. We kept nothing secret.	
6. Were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character.	6. Became completely ready for our higher power to remove all these weaknesses and angry memories.	
7. Humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings.	7. Without feeling like we were better than anyone else, we quietly asked our higher power to take away our weaknesses and the things inside that cause us problems.	
8. Made a list of all persons we had harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all.	8. Made another list, this time of all the people we had hurt or made angry at us by our behavior. Once our list was done we became completely ready to make apologies to everyone on the list and to change our behavior so it would not happen again.	
9. Made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others.	9. Made apologies to these people face to face, on the telephone, or wrote them a letter as soon as we could. The only time we did not make a direct apology was if it would hurt them or someone else.	

10. Continued to take personal inventory and when we were wrong promptly admitted it.	10. Continued to look at ourselves honestly and whenever we were wrong or hurt someone else we immediately admitted it, apologized and worked on changing our behavior so it would not happen again.
11. Sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God, as we understood Him, praying only for knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out.	11. We learned how to pray and meditate every day which helped us get to know our higher power better. When we prayed we only asked how we could help, how to behave well, and for the strength and power to do it.
12. Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these Steps, we tried to carry this message to alcoholics, and to practice these principles in all our affairs.	12. Once we had done all of the other steps we realized that we had formed a close new relationship with our higher power, whom many of us now call God. We spent time trying to help other alcoholics and addicts remembering that all we could do was give them support, getting sober was their responsibility. Because we wanted to stay sober and keep recovering, every day we practiced doing all of the things we had learned.
